## Details

#### WP1

# Language testing and assessment in society: Background. Considerations in test design and implementation

In this session first, we will start with the origins and traditions of educational assessment by outlining key phases in the history of educational assessment. We will then explore the different approaches to language testing over recent decades, focusing on the challenge of notions of communicative competence and the impact this has had on practices. Test purposes in terms of traditional educational purposes and current and emerging purposes in migration and travel will be discussed.

Next, we will look at test design in detail, including test constructs, performance testing, marking criteria, and language bands/standards. We will explore how test constructs should be developed using different test formats and how test quality indicators can be implemented and interpreted. We will also look at how task-based tests can be designed and used. How task-based tests can facilitate teaching and learning. What kinds of benefits can task-based tests bring to the classroom?

#### WP2

#### Tests and technology. Formative assessment & learning

First, in this session, we will examine the use of technology in language tests, what are the pros and cons of using technology in test construction, test delivery and marking. How do computerbased language tests compare to paper-based language tests. What are the future directions in incorporating technology in tests to widen test uses?

Next, we will look at the framing of assessment as a learning tool within language programs. We will examine formative assessment, learner autonomy, self-assessment, and assessment for learning, and the ways in which these uses of assessment shape learner awareness and identity. We will also look at teaching and the teacher's instructional and social roles to understand emerging constructions of the relationship between education and assessment.

#### WP3

# Statistics in language test: Understanding test scores. Applying comparative judgment in language assessment

In this session, first, we will examine how we can understand test scores and interpret them in different contexts, considering different test purposes, such as criterion-referenced vs. norm-referenced tests. We will also use test data and statistics to inform various ways to improve test construction and quality. Standard setting methods will also be introduced to decide on cut scores for tests.

Next, an alternative assessment approach, comparative judgment, will be introduced. The potential and application of this approach in language assessment will be discussed. Examples of research conducted using this approach will be shared.
